Chairman's Message

Thank you for changing the future of children with cancer with us



Viva Foundation for Children with Cancer (VIVA) was established in 2006. Over the last nine years, VIVA has focused on a number of strategic projects and programmes. This includes setting up the VIVA-University Children's Cancer Centre in National University Hospital (NUH), bringing together various partners to form a hub for childhood cancer in Novena Specialist Centre and kick-starting a school for children recovering from cancer.

On top of these, VIVA has been supporting various clinical research studies to improve the cure rates of children with cancer, and also organises a yearly childhood cancer conference called St Jude-VIVA Forum in Paediatric Oncology, to aid in the training and education of doctors and nurses.

2014 was a special year for us as we managed to secure the funding and support for VIVA's next strategic project – a Centre for Translational Research in Acute Leukaemia (CenTRAL). A partnership between VIVA and the National University of Singapore (NUS), this is a research centre which will focus

on improving the cure rates and quality of life of children with blood cancers through accurate diagnostics and treatment response. The centre will also conduct research on cell-based therapy – a new approach to treating cancer by harnessing a child's own immune system to attack and kill cancerous cells.

In 2014, VIVA managed to raise \$1.53 million for strategic projects, programmes and operational expenses. This has only been possible through the generous giving of our donors as well as companies and schools who helped organise various fundraising activities. We are also thankful to partners who have selflessly provided their pro-bono services towards VIVA, as well as volunteers who gave their time and energy to help in various VIVA programmes and initiatives. To our dear donors, partners and volunteers, your giving has been life-giving. From the bottom of our hearts, we thank you for your contributions and support which have made VIVA's work and achievements possible.

On behalf of the VIVA Board, I would also like to express our heartfelt gratitude to Mrs Theresa Foo – who served as VIVA's Chairman from February 2006 to September 2014, laying a strong and solid foundation for VIVA.

While we celebrate the achievements of 2014, there is certainly still more work to be done in the field of childhood cancer. We have made a lot of headway in helping cure children with blood cancers like leukaemia. Now, we need to focus on helping children with solid cancers like brain tumours as they currently have a much lower cure rate. Towards this end, we will be embarking on a collaboration with KK Women's and Children's Hospital to kick-start a VIVA-KKH childhood brain and solid cancers programme. To get this going, VIVA will need to raise at least \$2.7 million per year for the next 3 years and we hope you can support us. We believe research and leading-edge clinical care are the answers to helping children with solid cancers, and we hope you will continue to journey on with us.

We may not be able to change history, but with your support, let's rewrite the future!



Overview

The childhood cancer landscape in Singapore is made up of various hospitals, charities and organisations. Each of us may have a different area of focus, but all of us collectively work towards helping children with cancer.

Since our inception, VIVA Foundation has chosen to focus on the areas of (i) Research, (ii) Medical Care and (iii) Education as these are key in saving the lives of children with cancer. VIVA believes in not just treating a child, but in curing a child. More than helping a child to survive his or her journey with cancer, we continuously aim to ensure he or she will live on, with as little side effects as possible.

In collaboration with our key partners – namely St Jude Children's Research Hospital (St Jude), the National University Health System (NUHS) and KK Women's and Children's Hospital (KKH), VIVA raises and dedicates much of its funding towards research studies, clinical trials, medical facilities and the training and education of doctors and nurses.

By not just lobbying, but bringing focus, funds and facilities to children with cancer, VIVA spurs partners such as public institutions and the government to match our contributions. Overall, this brings about a much greater amount of resources and funding to the field of childhood cancer research, at a much faster rate, as opposed to waiting for institutional budgets to be apportioned. There is no time to waste when young lives are at stake, and VIVA seeks to play a strategic, catalytic and impactful role in bringing the best level of care and cure to children with cancer.

Every child deserves the right to live and the right to achieve the full potential of his or her life. This right shouldn't be taken away from them, nor should they be taken away from their parents and families.






2014 in review

Summary

2014 was an exciting year for VIVA. The research studies supported by VIVA continued to show good results and improved cure rates. To build on this progress, VIVA and NUS also agreed to collaborate in setting up a state-of-the-art translational research lab which will develop better ways of treating children with blood cancers like leukaemia. Here's a summary of the key programmes and initiatives which VIVA focused on in 2014











Key Programmes & Initiatives

VIVA-SUPPORTED RESEARCH & CLINICAL STUDIES





- ➤ Through VIVA's support, VUC³ in NUH is able to drive or participate in 13 clinical studies. Most of these studies are still ongoing, with some recently completed.
- These studies enrol children who have cancer, and place them on suitable treatment protocols and roadmaps. The children are then treated and studied over a long period, usually lasting at least 10 years.
- These studies enable doctors to monitor the children's progress during and post treatment, in order to determine the best treatment protocols for them as well as other children in the future who may suffer from the same cancers.
- ➤ Of these 13 trials, 4 are multi-centre clinical studies led by NUH, involving KKH and 2 other hospitals in Malaysia. Known as Ma-spore Clinical Studies, these studies have shown great results in not just improving the cure rate but also reducing the side effects of treatment on children.

- ➤ Under the Ma-spore ALL (Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia) Studies, cure rates have been raised to 90% for VUC³ children in NUH. While under the Maspore AML (Acute Myeloid Leukaemia) 2006 Studies, cure rates are now 75%.
- ★ Other ongoing trials which NUH participates in include the St Jude AML 2008 Study (for high risk AML) which have a cure rate of 67%.
- The support from VIVA allows NUH to bring on board sufficient clinical study coordinators and research data executives such that the clinical studies are properlystaffed and executed. A great part of this support has been made possible by the Goh Foundation which contributed \$12 million in 2009 towards the VIVA-GOH Paediatric Oncology Gift.
- ★ VIVA believes by focusing on the area. of research, the results will not only save children today but children tomorrow as well

VIVA-NUS CENTRE FOR TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH IN ACUTE LEUKAEMIA (CenTRAL)



- Research is life-saving and transformative only when it can be translated from the bench to the bedside; or from scientists to patients. Seeing the need to further translational research for childhood cancer in Singapore, VIVA spent the last three years raising funds for a new strategic project.
- By 2014, VIVA has managed to raise a total of \$10 million (including \$2 million for cellbased therapy) which will go towards setting up a centre for diagnosis, prognostication and treatment of children and young adults with acute leukaemia. Funds raised were from Children's Cancer Foundation, Lee Foundation, the Singapore Totaliser Board as well as an anonymous donor.
- ➤ On 31 July 2014, the first Gift Agreement between VIVA Foundation and NUS was signed in support of the cell-based/ cancer immunotherapy programme. On 30 November 2014, the second Gift Agreement was signed to confirm the full partnership for this project.

- The centre will be named the VIVA-NUS Centre for Translational Research in Acute Leukaemia (CenTRAL) and will be housed in the Centre of Translational Medicine in NUS
- The primary mission of CenTRAL is to make significant advances in risk classification and treatment monitoring, and to develop novel therapies. Within the scope of CenTRAL are the development of new tests and therapies, and the translation of new discoveries into clinically applicable interventions which will benefit patients with acute leukaemia in Singapore and the region. By reducing the incidence of relapse and treatment toxicity through optimised conventional treatment and novel therapies, CenTRAL should also be able to significantly reduce healthcare costs.
- ★ The VIVA-NUS CenTRAL commenced construction and will be completed in 2H 2015.

Key Programmes & Initiatives

VIVA-UNIVERSITY CHILDREN'S CANCER CENTRE (VUC³)



- Through the generous support of donors, VIVA managed to established a one-stop cancer centre for treatment of children cancer at NUH and this was launched in 2009.
- → Over the last 5 years, VUC³ has established itself as a centre of excellence for the clinical care and treatment of childhood cancer in Singapore, for Singapore and the region.
- ★ Today, VUC³ comprises of outpatient clinics, a day-therapy centre for children to receive chemotherapy and an inpatient centre which holds beds, stem cell transplant rooms and isolation rooms.

- With VIVA's funding and support, VUC³ has the capacity to handle more children and also the capability to handle increasingly complex cases of childhood cancer from both Singapore and the surrounding region.
- In 2014, the Centre saw and treated more than 130 new children. This is more than 3 times what the original childhood cancer ward in NUH handled in 2006. In 2014, the Centre supported more than 820 inpatient admissions and over 9500 outpatient cases. In 2014, the Centre also handled 18 Blood & Marrow Transplants for children with cancer.











VIVA-CCF HUB IN NOVENA SPECIALIST CENTRE

- ★ In 2011, Far East Organisation generously gave VIVA Foundation the 3rd floor of the Novena Specialist Centre in order to help children with cancer.
- ★ With a vision of creating a childhood cancer hub – VIVA pulled together the key charities and organisations in Singapore to form the VIVA-CCF Hub.
- The Hub was officially opened by First Lady Mrs Mary Tan in March 2013.
 Today, the Hub houses VIVA Foundation, Children's Cancer Foundation (CCF), the Singapore Cord Blood Bank, the Bone Marrow Donor Program as well as a PALS school for children with cancer.
- As children have low immunity while they are undergoing treatment like chemotherapy and radiotherapy, the PALS school provides a safe and infection-controlled environment for the children to study and play until they are ready to transition back into the mainstream schools.
- The PALS school was catalysed by VIVA through a \$250,000 donation from the Singapore Ireland Fund, and today operated by CCF,
- → In 2014, 56 staff from the various organisations were based in the VIVA-CCF Hub, and the PALS school within the Hub was attended by 48 children.

8TH ST JUDE-VIVA FORUM



- ★ The St Jude-VIVA Forum is the combined effort of VIVA Foundation and the St Jude International Outreach Program, and it is supported by NUH and KKH.
- Through this annual Forum, VIVA facilitates for the transfer of knowledge between countries on the latest and best practices in research and medical care for children with cancer. By doing so, VIVA hopes that more children with cancer in Singapore and the region will stand a higher chance of cure and survival, regardless of geography.
- ★ The 8th St Jude-VIVA Forum (SJVF) had the unique honour and opportunity to be held in conjunction with the 16th International Symposium on Paediatric Neuro-Oncology (ISPNO) which came to Singapore for the first time. The SJVF was held at the Shangri-La Hotel, Singapore from 28-29 June 2014.

- ★ 16 world experts from USA, Germany, The Netherlands, United Kingdom and Singapore were involved in SJVF 2014.
- The total attendance at the Forum was 227, with delegates from Singapore and beyond (Australia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, Denmark, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand and Vietnam) testament to how the Forum is growing as an important platform for education and collaboration
- On Day 2, due to ISPNO, an additional 167 delegates attended the SJVF

 making it the highest number of attendees to attend SJVF on one day.

PRE-FORUM WORKSHOP 2014



- ★ The Pre-Forum Workshop 2014 took place on 26-27 June 2014, just before the 8th SJVF.
- ★ It is a unique platform which brings together participants from the region to discuss developments and cases in a workshop, classroom style format.
- For 2014, the Pre-Forum Workshop focused on Acute-Lymphoblastic Leukaemia ((ALL), Retinoblastoma and Palliative Care.
- Invited speakers from Singapore and other countries guided the discussions and gave

- advice on protocols, data analysis and on the management of cases which were presented by regional doctors.
- ★ Altogether, there were 55 participants for Pre-Forum Workshop 2014 from a total of 15 countries.
- At the end of the workshop, the group agreed to kick-start a collaboration to improve the care of retinoblastoma in the region and will present their research and outcomes in 2015's Pre-Forum Workshop.

The St Jude-VIVA Forum has been an annual highlight among the paediatric oncology community not just in Singapore but regionally. It has certainly played an important role in advancing research, raising standard of care and improving survival of childhood cancers. This is the event many of us look forward yearly.

Key Programmes & Initiatives

VIVA-ASIA COLLABORATIVE WORKING GROUPS



As part of VIVA's efforts to achieve better cancer care and cure in Singapore and to inspire the rest of Asia, there are two ongoing collaborations taking place among doctors and hospitals in the region today.

VIVA-ASIA WORKING GROUP FOR ACUTE LEUKAEMIA (VAWGM)

- The VAWGM encourages clinicians, scientists and researchers in acute leukeamia to meet and develop ideas on how to standardise, collaborate and support one another. This is done with the aim of translating the success achieved in childhood leukaemia therapy in developed countries into developing countries.
- The VAWGM met in Singapore on 27
 June 2014 and was attended by 10
 representatives from 4 countries. They
 were joined by VIVA EAB Chair Dr Pui
 and Member Dr Handgretinger who
 provided expert advice. The group agreed
 to embark on a clinical trial using oral
 arsenol and both NUH and KKH will
 participate in this study.

VIVA-ASIA WORKI<mark>NG G</mark>ROUP FOR BONE MARROW TRANSPLANT (VABMT)


- The VABMT is a platform for learning and sharing of knowledge across the various hospitals in Asia. The working group has been actively exploring and implementing opportunities to work together in research and strategic planning for paediatric bone marrow transplants in the region.
- The VABMT met on 27 June 2014 in Singapore. Chaired by Dr Godfrey Chan from Hong Kong, it was attended by 23 members from 8 countries. In this full-day meeting, the group reviewed the work done over the last 12 months. Some of the outcomes include 10 protocols for supportive care being developed, 2 standardised clinical transplant protocols established and 3 new joint research papers submitted for publication.

PAEDIATRIC BRAIN TUMOUR AWARENESS DAY

Every year, about 40 children in Singapore are diagnosed with malignant brain tumours. It is the second most common cancer in children, after leukaemia. The inaugural Paediatric Brain Tumour Awareness Day in Singapore was organised by the Brain Tumour Society (Singapore) to raise awareness of the illness. They were supported by volunteers from the Duke-NUS Graduate Medical School. Chairman of VIVA Foundation – Mrs Jennifer Yeo was

the Guest of Honour at the event. In her speech, she shared about her own personal experience as a parent of a childhood cancer survivor, and this inspired and encouraged many parents in the audience. She proceeded to flag-off 24 Lamborghinis – which ferried young patients on a joyride from the KK Women's and Children's Hospital to Kallang Leisure Park, the rally's end-point. The children were elated to ride in these super-cars!



GROWING THE ST JUDE-VIVA FORUM

into a multi-faceted education and collaboration platform for not just scientists, doctors, but nurses and families as well. It is our long-term vision that Singapore and the Forum will grow in international stature and be recognised as a leading platform and hub for the exchange of knowledge in childhood cancer.



OFFICIALLY LAUNCHING VIVA'S THIRD KEY FACILITY

the VIVA-NUS Centre for Translational Research in Acute Leukaemia (CenTRAL) which will further build on the good progress made in improving the cure rates of blood cancers like leukaemia, by translating more cures and novel therapies from the bench to the bedside.



INCREASING OUR FOCUS ON CLINICAL CARE AND RESEARCH FOR CHILDHOOD BRAIN AND SOLID TUMOURS

by establishing a new partnership with KK Women's and Children's Hospital. Blood cancers such as leukaemia now see a higher cure rate in Singapore, however outcomes for most childhood solid tumours still remain inferior to blood cancers. Brain tumours are the second more common childhood cancer after Leukaemia, and hence there is a need for VIVA to now focus more on solid cancers. World-renown St Jude Children's Research Hospital (Memphis, Tennessee, USA) has already pledged their support in the form of expertise and knowledge-exchange behind this project. In order to get this 3-year programme going by 2016, VIVA will help to raise \$8.2 million, while KKH will be committing \$4.75 million of their own funds. This means VIVA will need to raise. at least \$2.7 million per year for the next 3 years.




- 1. The Foundation shall maintain a reserve of at least \$1 million (in accordance to reserve policy approved by VIVA Board in June 2015).

- A. In 2014, a cash gift of \$1,000,000 was made to the National University of Singaproe to fund its cancer immunotherapy clinical research as part of the CenTRAL project.
- B. VIVA received a donated space from Far East Organisation in Feb 2011 at the Novena Specialist Centre. This amount captures the property depreciation of this donated space.
- C. For the calendar year of 2014, no staff was paid more than \$100,000 in salaries and related costs. For the year 2015, this will be declared accordingly in Annual Report 2015.
- D. VIVA has an available fund balance of \$4,825,711. The remaining \$22,292.501 is considered as unavailable funds and is only reflective of a valuation of its donated premises.
- E. As the premises donated to VIVA is zoned as a donated civic and community institution space, it cannot be monetised or rented out for profit. Today, VIVA manages this space as a licensor, sharing it with other childhood cancer related organisations.
