VIVA Foundation for Children with Cancer (VIVA) was established in 2006 to focus on saving the lives of children with cancer through excellence in medical care, research and education.

Over the last 10 years, through the support and generosity of our donors and supporters, VIVA has been able to develop facilities, programmes and initiatives in order to help children with cancer. One of these facilities is the VIVA-CCF Hub at Novena Specialist Centre which was very generously gifted to VIVA by Far East Organisation in 2011.

2015 was a very special year for VIVA. In partnership with the National University of Singapore (NUS) and the Children's Cancer Foundation (CCF), a key research facility - the VIVA-NUS CenTRAL (Centre for Translational Research in Acute Leukaemia) was successfully set up. In 2015, VIVA also embarked on a new strategic collaboration with KK Women's and Children's Hospital (KKH). This collaboration focuses on studying, supporting and improving the outcomes of children with brain and solid tumours.

In terms of programmes and initiatives, VIVA organised the 9th St Jude VIVA-Forum in Paediatric Oncology in 2015, and also continued to support research work and efforts by scientists, doctors and nurses.

VIVA supports and raises funds towards all these facilities and initiatives, so that children with cancer today will receive the best of medical care and attention, while children of tomorrow will benefit from the research and knowledge exchange taking place today.

VIVA believes that cutting-edge research work and improved care is vital not only in saving children but also in minimising late-life effects due to early-life treatment. This way, more children

will not only be able to overcome their cancer, but also go on to achieve the full potential of their lives.

Childhood Cancer in Singapore in 2015



In 2015, 157 Children in Singapore were diagnosed with childhood cancer.



At least 12 different types of childhood cancer were diagnosed in these children.




Around 54% of these are blood cancers, and around 46% are solid cancers.





The two most common cancers afflicting children in Singapore in 2015 are leukaemia (about 40%) and brain tumours (about 15%).



VIVA-KKH Paediatric Brain and Solid Tumour Programme This unique programme focuses on bringing about integrated clinical care to children with solid cancers. This programme will also embark on translational research for childhood brain and solid tumours in Singapore as such research is critical in finding new and better ways to fight such cancers in children.

Programmes & Projects

2015 was an exciting year for VIVA. The research studies supported by VIVA continued to show good results and improved survival rates. We set up a state-of-the-art research lab which will develop better ways of treating children with blood cancers like leukaemia and also embarked on a collaboration to help children with brain and solid tumours. Here's a summary of the key programmes and initiatives which VIVA focused on in 2015.



VIVA Nursing Doll Project

With funds contributed by VIVA's CSR Partner - Elsevier, nurses at the VUC3 worked with a local developer to design VIVA Nursing Dolls to help nurses educate children and their families on how certain medical procedures will be carried out, along with special comic books written and drawn by the nurses themselves.

@ Novena Specialist Centre

VIVA manages the VIVA-CCF Hub which is located on the 3rd floor of the Novena Specialist Centre. It houses 4 different organisations which help children with cancer, as well as a school for children recovering from cancer. In 2015, 72 staff were based in the Hub and the school (operated by CCF) was attended by 39 children.

VIVA-NUS CenTRAL VIVA-NUS Centre for Translational Research in Acute Leukaemia

VIVA successfully brought together partners and supporters to set up and soft-launched the VIVA-NUS CenTRAL in 2015. Located on Level 9 of the NUS Centre of Translational Medicine, it is a research and diagnostic facility focusing on improving the diagnosis, treatment and cures for acute leukaemia. CenTRAL was set up in partnership with Children's Cancer Foundation and made possible through support from Lee Foundation, Tote Board and Singapore Turf Club.



VIVA-KKH Paediatric Brain and Solid Tumour Programme

VIVA and KKH signed an agreement in 2015 to collaborate on studying, supporting and improving the outcomes of children with brain and solid tumours through a \$12.95 million programme. (Elaboration on Pg 13)



VIVA organised the 9th St Jude-VIVA Forum (SJVF) from 26-30 March in Singapore, with an expanded programme which consists of a medical conference, a pre-forum workshop, a nursing symposium and a family learning exchange to help educate, train doctors and nurses so they can in turn help more children with cancer. Altogether, there were about 460 participants in 2015's SJVF activities. (Elaboration on Pg 14)

VIVA-Supported Clinical and Research Studies

- Research is vital in finding the right cures for children with cancer. Through VIVA's support, NUH and KKH currently run 16 clinical and research studies which actively enroll children with cancer. VIVA hopes that through the support of these studies, more children with cancer can be cured
- For instance, the Malaysia-Singapore Clinical Studies led by NUH has shown how a clinical study which started in 2003 for Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia (ALL) achieved an overall survival rate of 91.9 % for children treated in Singapore at NUH and KKH. A 2nd clinical study was introduced in 2010, and this has shown the overall survival rate for ALL increased to 93.1% as of December 2015, at the 5-year mark of this 2nd study.
- A clinical study for Acute Myeloid Leukaemia (AML) which started in 2006 has also shown promising results, with the overall survival rate (taken recently at the 10 year mark) standing at 81.7% for children with cancer treated in NUH and KKH.
- The support from VIVA allows NUH and KKH to bring on board sufficient clinical study coordinators and research data executives such that the clinical studies are properly staffed and executed. A great part of this support has been made possible by the Goh Foundation which contributed \$12 million in 2009 towards the VIVA-GOH Paediatric Oncology Gift.








New Discovery Due To Childhood Cancer Research

- ➤ Based on research work, a new discovery was made in 2015. This discovery shows that one in five Singaporean children undergoing chemotherapy for acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (ALL) has an inherited genetic variation that makes them sensitive to standard doses of chemotherapy.
- Scientists found that inherited NUDT15 gene variants in the children lead to the severe side-effects. These children along with other Asian children were found to suffer excess side effects when given mercaptopurine a chemotherapy drug that is the cornerstone of successful paediatric ALL treatment even at dosages much lower than the recommended levels in the United States.



- These findings came in an international study led by St Jude Children's Research Hospital involving 270 children from Singapore, Guatemala and Japan with ALL. VIVA-Goh Professor in Paediatric Oncology A/Prof Allen Yeoh from the NUS led the Singapore research.
- This discovery is paving the way for more precise treatment of blood cancers. This is because by screening for NUDT15 variants in children with ALL, doctors can potentially personalise their chemotherapy doses based on their genotype and avoid toxicity without compromising treatment effectiveness.



VIVA-KKH Paediatric Brain and Solid Tumour Programme

- In 2015, VIVA embarked on a collaboration with KK Women's and Children's Hospital (KKH) to kick-start a VIVA-KKH Childhood Brain and Solid Tumour Programme. An MOU was signed on 27th March 2015 between VIVA, KKH as well as St Jude Children's Research Hospital. The USA-based St Jude will help to provide expert knowledge and advice towards this programme.
- This unique programme will focus on bringing about integrated clinical care to children with solid cancers as they have to be seen and treated by a whole village of doctors and nurses from various sub-specialities ranging from oncology to radiology to surgery to pathology. This programme will also embark on translational research for childhood brain and solid tumours in Singapore as such research is critical in finding new and better ways to fight such cancers in children, while trying to minimise the harm caused by drugs, radiation or surgery. Achieving this is very important, as we aim for children to be cured with as little lateeffects in life as possible, so they can enjoy a good future.
- Although much has been done to study solid tumours in Caucasian and African-American populations, little is still known about childhood solid tumours in Asian children. Focusing research in this area will bring about better understanding of the tumours in Asian children, allowing our scientists and doctors to develop the right treatments approaches for our local and regional populations.
- To run this multi-faceted programme which covers translational research, clinical care, training and education, a total funding of \$12.95 million is required. KKH has committed \$4.75 million of its own manpower and funding towards this programme, and VIVA has pledged to help raise \$8.2 million to make this programme a reality.





9th St Jude-VIVA Forum in Paediatric Oncology

- Organised annually by VIVA Foundation, the 9th St Jude-VIVA Forum was successfully held from 26-30 March 2015 in Singapore.
- ➤ St Jude-VIVA Forum aims to become an international platform of learning exchange and collaboration for paediatric oncologists, scientists and nurses from all over the world, with Singapore as the hub for learning, sharing and transferring of knowledge between countries.
- The St Jude-VIVA Forum is a two-day medical conference that consists of a series of lectures and seminars with an emphasis on shared protocols and ways of treating children with cancer. Delegates have the opportunity to learn from and network with a number of world leaders in the field of paediatric oncology.
- There were 10 world speakers and more than 250 delegates from 23 countries.







Programmes & Projects

VIVA-Asia Pre-Forum Workshop

- ➤ VIVA Pre-Forum Workshop brings together the local and regional medical community to learn from one another at the National University Hospital of Singapore. Arranged in a smaller group setting, delegates discuss topics such as treatment, data management and evaluation of outcomes of solid tumours and leukaemias, as well as updates on participating centres and their research papers.
- There were about 80 delegates attending the VIVA-Asia 2015 Pre-Forum Workshop.

Inaugural VIVA-Asia Nursing Symposium

The Nursing Symposium is a one-day session that allows nurses from Singapore and the surrounding region, especially those working in paediatric oncology, to learn about the topics presented at the forum and participate in practical simulation training and hands-on sessions. This inaugural symposium saw close to 70 nurses participating.

Inaugural CCF-VIVA Family Learning Exchange

- Co-organised with CCF, this Family
 Learning Exchange gives the parents and
 caregivers of our young patients the opportunity
 to learn from experts in the field of paediatric
 oncology focusing specifically on the total
 care and well-being of a child with cancer.
 Held jointly by CCF and VIVA for the first time
 as part of St Jude-VIVA Forum programme, the
 exchange was attended by close to 60 parents.
- ➤ VIVA would like to thank Dr Sally Blair from NUH for working with us to put together this Forum, as well as other doctors and nurses who contributed to the success of this annual programme. VIVA would also like to thank Volunteer Ms Sophie Webb for her support in organising the 9th Forum.


Keio University Support VIVA

^{1.} In 2015, a programme funding of \$2,700,000 was made to the KKH Health Endowment Fund to fund the treatment and cure for children with brain and solid tumour cancer in Singapore, and \$1,482,285 was made to National University of Singapore to support the advancement of education and research with the establishment of a Centre for Translational Research in Acute Leukaemia (CenTRAL).

^{2.} This amount includes depreciation cost of the space at the Novena Specialist Centre, a donated civic and community institution space. It cannot be monetised or rented out for profit.

^{3.} VIVA manages this space as a licensor, sharing it with other childhood cancer related organisations with IPC status.

^{4.} During the financial year 2015, one staff personnel received an annual remuneration within the band of \$100,000.00 to \$150,000.00. No staff is involved in setting his or her own remuneration.
